ORDER

This case is before the Court on the Receiver's Unopposed Sixth and Final Application for Order Awarding Fees, Costs, and Reimbursement of Costs to Receiver and Her Professionals. (Doc. 149). The Court, having reviewed the Application, noting that the fees and costs requested therein are reasonable, necessary, and commensurate with the skills and experience required for the activities performed and described therein, and that the FTC does not object to the Application, and otherwise being fully advised in the matter, finds good cause to approve the Application and grant the relief requested therein.

Accordingly, it is hereby

ORDERED:

1. The Receiver's Unopposed Sixth and Final Application for Order Awarding Fees, Costs, and Reimbursement of Costs to Receiver and Her Professionals (Doc. 149) is **GRANTED**.

2. The Receiver is **AUTHORIZED** to make the following payments from the Receivership assets:
 - a. \$10,562.90 to Maria M. Yip, Receiver,
 - b. \$30,425.69 to Yip Associates,
 - c. \$4,608.00 to Johnson, Newlon & DeCort, and
 - d. \$2,688.50 to E-Hounds.
3. Any monies not used are to be turned over to the FTC.
4. No later than February 20, 2026, the Receiver will file a closing declaration.
